

Greenways are corridors of land and water that connect places and people in McLean County. These open spaces are located within natural or manmade areas and protect habitats, wildlife, and resources. They often contain trails or paths for alternative transportation, offer recreational opportunities, and add to the quality of life.

## Greenways Advisory Committee

The McLean County Greenways Advisory Committee (GAC) in cooperation with the McLean County Regional Planning Commission (MCRPC) is responsible for developing the greenways plan and the greenways website.

For more than 20 years the GAC has coordinated and advised efforts between planning staff, individuals, and organizations with a stake in greenways planning. This includes government and non-profit agencies, recreational and environmental groups, farmers, landowners, and others.

Key activities are:

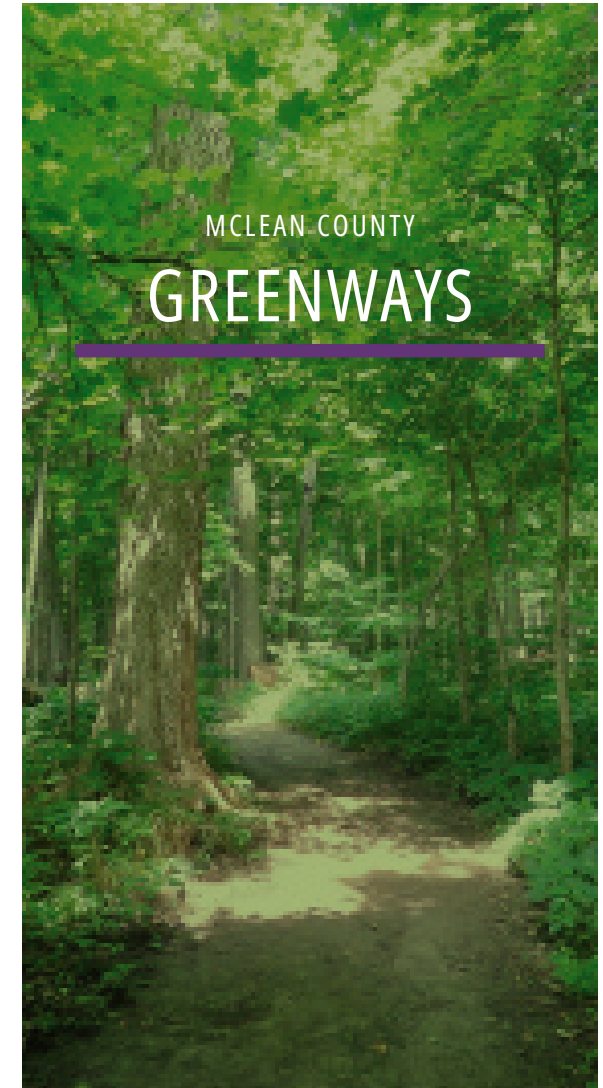
- Creation and implementation of a McLean County Greenways plan

- Advocacy and education about providing greenways for conservation and recreation

- Serving as a networking hub for related groups and stakeholders interested in protecting and promoting greenways for public use.
